Or my cousin in Roxbury?" -- CHORUS

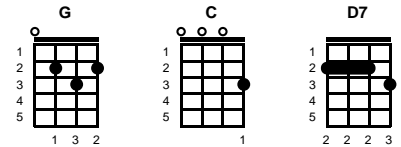
v4:
