The Beatles Performances in the United States February, 1964

It was February, 1964, when The Beatles first appeared live on television in the United States. On consecutive Sundays, the group appeared on the Ed Sullivan Show (Feb. 9, 16, and 23). And after their first appearance on US television, they performed three concerts. The first concert was at Washington Coliseum on Feb. 11, and the second two concerts were at Carnegie Hall on Feb. 12. The Beatles landed at New York's JFK Airport on Feb. 7, two days before their first appearance, and, it is said, music in America was never the same.

ne of the biggest events in US television history occurred on February 9, 1964 when host Ed Sullivan welcomed the Beatles on his Sunday evening variety show for their first of three scheduled performances. It is estimated that 73.7 million people in over 23 million homes tuned in to watch the show – more than 45% of American households. The appearance set a new record for television viewing figures capturing a 60% share, meaning that 60% of the television's turned on were tuned in to Ed Sullivan and The Beatles. The Beatles sang two sets.

Set 1

- 1. All My Loving"
- 2. "Till There Was You"
- 3. "She Loves You"

Set 2

As big as it was, this was not the first time the Beatles had been mentioned on American television. In the previous months, the Beatles had been the subject of news stories on American TV as their fame in the UK and Europe soared. And, on January 3, footage of the Beatles performing a concert in Bournemouth, England was shown on the late night Jack Paar Show. Nor was this the first visit by any member of the Beatles to America. The previous September, George Harrison traveled to Benton, Ill., to visit his sister, Louise Caldwell.

On **February 11th**, two days after appearing on the Sullivan show, the group gave a concert at the Washington Coliseum before 8,092 fans. The next day, **February 12th**, they traveled to New York to give two concerts at the Carnegie Hall before audiences of 2,900 fans each. The set list for all three concerts was identical. Eight of the songs were written by The Beatles and four of the songs were covers.

On **February 16th**, the Beatles made their second televised appearance on "The Ed Sullivan Show," playing for an audience of about 70 million people, 40% of the American population. This appearance was broadcast from The Deauville Hotel in Miami Beach, Florida. Again, they performed two sets.

- 2. "This Boy"
- 3. "All My Loving"

Finally, a week later on **February 23rd**, the quartet made their third scheduled appearance on the Ed Sullivan show, a three-song set taped on Feb. 9, the day of their first appearance on the Sullivan TV show. On this show, The Beatles sang

- 1. "Twist and Shout"
- 2. "Please Please Me"
- 3. "I Want to Hold Your Hand"

They would have four more #1 hits during 1964 including:

- "Can't Buy Me Love" (five weeks, April 4 May 2)
- "Love Me Do" (May 30)
- "A Hard Day's Night" (two weeks, August 1 & August 8)
- "I Feel Fine" (December 26)

One other song by Paul McCartney would reach #1 in the US during 1964: Peter and Gordon's "A World Without Love" (June 27)

A year and a half later, on **September 12th, 1965**, The Beatles made their fourth and final appearance on the Ed Sullivan Show. They played

This performance was taped in New York on August 14th, 1965, just one day before the Beatles kicked off their North American Tour with a concert at Shea Stadium that set the attendance record for an outdoor show at the time.

These four historic Beatles performances on The Ed Sullivan Show featured 20 Beatles songs—seven of which became Number One hits. Cumulatively, the four shows attracted an audience of a 250 *million* people. In terms of percentage of America's population, the first two shows remain the highest viewed regularly scheduled television programs of all time.
