February 9, 1964 – The Ed Sullivan Show

t was one of the biggest events in TV history when television host Ed Sullivan welcomed the Beatles on his Sunday evening variety show for their first appearance on American television. It is estimated that 73.7 million people in over 23 million homes tuned in to watch the show – more than 45% of American households. The appearance set a new record for television viewing figures capturing a 60% share, meaning that 60% of the television's turned on were tuned in to Ed Sullivan and The Beatles. The Beatles sang two sets.

Set 1

- "All My Loving"
- "Till There Was You"
- "She Loves You" (this song would become their 2nd Billboard Hot 100 #1 song, March 21 through March 28.)

Set 2

- "I Saw Her Standing There"
- "I Want To Hold Your Hand" (on February 1st this became their first Billboard Hot 100 #1 song. It held that spot for seven consecutive weeks.)

They sang both of their first two Billboard Hot 100 #1 hits on their first appearance. They would make two more appearances on the Ed Sullivan Show in the month of February, the 16th and the 23rd. They would also perform their first live concerts, the first at the Washington Coliseum on Feb. 11, and the second at New York's Carnegie Hall on Feb. 12 (2 shows).

The Beatles & the Hot 100 on April 4, 1964

On this date, songs recorded by the Beatles occupied the top five spots on the Billboard Hot 100, the first time this has ever happened (a record that would stand for xxx years). The top five were:

- 1. Can't Buy Me Love (their 3rd #1 hit)
- 2. Twist And Shout
- 3. She Loves You (their 2nd #1 hit)
- 4. I Want To Hold Your Hand (their 1st #1 hit)
- 5. Please, Please Me


They had seven other songs on the Hot 100 that day, giving them a one week total of 12 songs. The week before, March 28, 1964, the group had 10 songs on the Hot 100. In subsequent weeks, the group would continue their remarkable run of popular music on Billboard's Hot 100:

- Week of April 11, 1964: 14 songs, their highest number of songs on the Hot 100 in one week.
- Week of April 18, 1964: 12 songs
- Week of April 25, 1964: 10 songs

In 1964, the Beatles held the #1 slot on the Billboard Hot 100 for 14 consecutive weeks with three #1 hits: "I Want To Hold Your Hand" (7 weeks, February 1 - March 14), "She Loves You" (2 weeks, March 21 & March 28), and "Can't Buy Me Love" (5 weeks, April 4 - May 2). They had three other #1 hits in 1964:

- "Love Me Do" (May 30)
- "A Hard Day's Night" (2 weeks, August 1 & August 8)
- "I Feel Fine" (December 26)
