He was driving the powerful Engine No. 382, known as "Cannonball", on passenger service between Memphis and Canton, MS, one link of a four-train, high-speed run between Chicago and New Orleans.

When the lights on the caboose of the stalled freight train were spotted, Jones ordered his fireman to jump, then reversed the throttle and slammed the air brakes into emergency stop, but the engine plowed through several loaded freight cars before derailing. He had been able to reduce his speed from 75 miles per hour to about 40 miles per hour before the impact.
