Open Mic individual and group performers - 2 Song Limit. Keep things family friendly. Must have mostly ukuleles performing. Limit banter and introductions, with an 7 minute time limit.

## **Ukefest Tips:**

This is a campground, so plan accordingly for a day outside.

There are toilet facilities, running water, showers, electrical outlets and the camp office has a small store for incidentals.

There is no permanent food vendor at the campground, so we recommend you pack your own food / cooler. The Manic Organic Food Truck is currently scheduled to be at the fest. There are also two restaurants nearby: *Char Burger* (Corner Cha-Lakee Road and Highway 69) and *Fire by the Lake* (Left side, just before the bridge). Over the bridge there are several restaurants in Guntersville.

# OUR RULES AND VALUES

We expect all campers to help us serve as good stewards of this land.

We practice TVA Camp-Right Campground principles promoting sustainable, safe, high quality camping experiences that conserve the natural resources of this unique property.

We value our plant life. Trees may not be damaged in any way. RV siting must avoid tree damage.

We value our wildlife. No hunting or discharging of firearms in the campground or on surrounding property.

Avoid disturbing stream beds or wetland areas. No spraying of poison on land or water is permitted.

Do not allow gray water to drain onto ground. Sanitary Septic Dump stations are located throughout the campground for emptying holding tanks. Violation requires immediate eviction from the Campground with no refund.

Cut energy waste. Lights, electrical appliances (except refrigerators), air conditioners and water MUST be turned off while you are not camping. We are installing improved energy efficient lighting throughout the campground.

Reduce Water use Wash Campers, cars, boats, at the pump house across the street, and not in the Campground Avoid disturbing the land surface. Electrical, cable and water lines are beneath the ground. You will be responsible for any repairs needed if you cut a line. Check with management before digging.

Lots must be kept neat and tidy, with no unnecessary clutter. Trash should be disposed of properly, in dumpsters placed throughout the Campground. Do not put fish deanings or used motor oil in dumpsters. Cigarette disposal sites and trash cans for small items are placed throughout the park.

We value our pets. Pets must not be allowed to disturb other guests, and must be walked on a leash. Pets may not be tied or chained to a tree. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after pets. Clean up after your pets.

We value recycling. Recycling stations for aluminum are located throughout the campground.

We value our quite time. Quiet time is between 11 pm - 8 am on weekends, 10 pm - 8 am on weeknights. No loud music or disturbing noise permitted during this time. Children should be at their campsites during quiet time.

We like bikes. Please stay on trails, asphalt or gravel, and no bicycle riding after dark.

Avoid walking through another's camp site. Stay on the asphalt or on designated walking paths.

Public Intoxication will not be tolerated. Alcohol access to minors is prohibited on this property.

Space is provided for a maximum of two cars per camp site. Additional cars may be parked in the lot across the street from the office. Parking a boat at a campsite will take up one car spot. Do not park on another camper's site.

Motorcycles or motorbikes may not be driven in the Campground. No golf carts or children's motorized vehicles are allowed in the Campground (except those used by Campground management and ADA required). Storage of empty boat trailers is provided in designated areas. No empty boat trailers on your campsite.

Camping at Riverview Campground is subject to all TVA rules and guidelines. There may be no appliances meant for indoor use used outdoors. No permanent structures or roofs, and no decks over a certain size. Decks must be approved and deeded to management, and must be sturdy and safe, and removable. All TVA rules are located in the office, and we will discuss them at any time. All facilities are equally open to all members of the camping public.

Use all Campground facilities at your own risk. Campground management is not responsible for damage caused by acts of God, or for losses resulting from theft of property. All areas of the campground are subject to security video monitoring at any time. Visitors and Guests may register at the Campground Office in Area A.

You are responsible for your guest's actions. Make them aware of Riverview's Rules and Values.
